- People who live in the dwelling most of the year including :
 - people temporarily absent, (holiday, business trip, hospital stay of less than a month, etc.);
 - infants, even if they are still in a maternity ward ;
 - subtenants and roommates occupying a part of the dwelling.

Also include in list A :

- under-age children living elsewhere for their studies and for whom this dwelling is the family home ;
- spouses who have another residence for work reasons and who return to live in this dwelling on weekends, during holidays, etc. ;
- adults living in this dwelling for their studies ;
- people who are present in this dwelling and do not usually live elsewhere ;
- domestic workers, employees, and au-pair girls who live in this dwelling.

Do not include the persons who should be recorded in list B or list C.

Mrs Maurin is hosting her nephew Thomas Galard, age 15. His parents live in Dax and he is a student in Saint-Malo.

Jean Dupas, Mrs Maurin's father, is staying with his daughter for four months; the rest of the year, he lives in the Jura.

List B Adult children living elsewhere for their studies → Do not complete individual forms

Include in list B :

- Adult children living elsewhere for their studies (room in town, self contained dwelling, university residence, boarding institution, etc.) and who return to live in this dwelling on weekends, during holidays, etc.

List C Another occupants of the dwelling → Do not complete individual forms

Include in list C1 :

- under-age children living in this dwelling for their studies and whose parents reside in another municipality in France.

Include in list C2:

- children in the custody of another parent (owing to separation or divorce) or who, if under joint custody, live with the other parent most of the time ;
- people who live in this dwelling for work reasons and return to their family dwelling on weekends ;
- people who personally reside in this dwelling and are accommodated in an institution (retirement home or hospice, hospital stay of over one month, center for the disabled, workers' hostel, members of the Armed forces living in barracks or stationed abroad, prison, etc.);
- people who are living in this dwelling at the time of the census but reside in another dwelling most of the year.
